

## How to look for students in Peergrade

1. Start by entering your course in Absalon, choose *Peer Feedback* and select the assignment in Peergrade.
2. That brings you to this page. In this case, the feedback period is closed and you can see the dates and times as well as how many students have submitted and given feedback.



4. You can also get a **list of all students listed after scores** if you choose *Reviewers*.



5. In the *Flags* page, you will see if students have flagged some of the feedback. **Flagging allows a student to mark a particular piece of feedback that they disagree with or find incorrect.** The teacher will be alerted that a piece of feedback has been flagged and is then able to review the flagged feedback and make a final decision on what evaluation to give. In this case, there are no Flags.
6. In the *Rubric* page, you will have access to the rubric used for this assignment. You cannot change the rubric while the students are working with the feedback.
